eFiling enables importers to electronically submit compliance data, streamlining the process through U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) and securely storing certificates in the CPSC Product Registry.

Potential Benefits for Importers:

- Lower risk scores = fewer inspections
- Reduced hold times for compliant products
- Fewer examinations = lower costs
- Improved certificate data management

Benefits for CPSC:

- More targeted focus on high-risk products
- Faster inspections & resource allocation
- Greater efficiency in protecting consumers

Importers are required to verify and certify that their products meet compliance standards.

A product requires certification if it:

- Is subject to a consumer safety rule, ban, or regulation.
- Is imported for sale or storage.
- Is made available in U.S. commerce.

Types of Compliance Certificates

- Children's Product Certificate (CPC) – Required for products subject to children's safety standards. (Baby gear, toys, children's clothing, youth bicycles, etc.)
- General Certificate of Conformity (GCC) – Required for general use consumer products. (Adult bicycles, batteries, fireworks, contact adhesives, lighters, apparel, and more.)

Two Ways to Submit Compliance Data to CBP's ACE System:

- Full PGA Message Set: Submit all compliance data with every shipment (no Product Registry required).
- Reference PGA Message Set: Submit only a Certificate Identifier linked to pre-registered data in the CPSC Product Registry.

Key Takeaways:

- Full PGA – No need for a Business Account or Product Registry; data is submitted manually for each shipment.
- Reference PGA – Requires a CPSC Product Registry account to store compliance data and streamline future imports.
- The Product Registry allows manual entry, bulk uploads, or API integration to simplify compliance data management.

Option 1: Full PGA Message Set

- The importer provides their broker with the seven required product certificate data elements for the imported product and the broker files it in the CPSC PGA Message Set.

The required data elements include:

- Product ID
- Citation Codes
- Manufacture Date
- Manufacture Place
- Product Test Date
- Testing Laboratory
- Point of Contact

Full PGA Message Set

- Importers do not need to register with the CPSC Product Registry.
- All required compliance data is submitted directly to CBP for every shipment.
- There is no pre-storage of data, and each shipment requires a new full data submission.

Option 2: Reference PGA Message Set

- The importer pre-enters the product certificate data into the CPSC Product Registry and then provides their broker with the Certificate Identifiers to be filed in the PGA Message Set.

The Certificate Identifiers are:

- Certifier ID
- Product ID
- Version ID

Reference PGA Message Set

- Importers must create a Business Account in the CPSC Product Registry to pre-enter compliance data.
- A Business Account Administrator manages certificates and controls access for other team members.
- Instead of providing all compliance data with every shipment, importers only submit Certificate Identifiers (Certifier ID, Product ID, Version ID) that reference the pre-stored data in the registry.

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Timeline

- **2016-2017:** Initial Alpha Pilot with 8 importers.
- **2017-2018:** CPSC conducted a certificate study to assess compliance impact.
- **2020:** Commission approved a plan to create an eFiling program.
- **2023-2024:** Beta Pilot with 37 importers and trade partners.
- **2024-2025:** Expansion of the voluntary eFiling stage.
- **2025:** Final Rule published in the Federal Register.
- **July 8, 2026:** eFiling fully required for most imported consumer products.
 - CPSC has approved a Final Rule to implement eFiling of Certificate information for imported, regulated consumer products. Under the Final Rule, requirements impacting most imported consumer products will take effect on July 8th, 2026.
- **January 8, 2027:** eFiling required for Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) imports.

eFiling insights

DID YOU KNOW?

Since eFiling will require electronic submission of test data, brands that wait until the deadline in July 2026 may struggle to organize and submit past compliance records.



eFiling insights

DID YOU KNOW?

If your system isn't ready by mid-2025, you risk manually retrieving product and test data from multiple sources—especially if you manufacture in different countries or have variations in materials.

eFiling insights

DID YOU KNOW?

eFiling requires cross-departmental coordination, particularly between Customs (to ensure accurate HTS codes), Product Compliance, IT (to map data sources), and Merchandising teams (to track new product/sourcing changes).

eFiling insights

DID YOU KNOW?

eFiling isn't complete once data is in the CPSC Product Registry—importers must coordinate with their brokers to ensure it's properly linked to U.S. Customs through the ACE system, or risk costly shipment holds.


Chemical & Regulatory Compliance

Problem:

Managing PFAS, RSL, and other chemical regulations across global markets is resource-intensive and prone to oversight.

Solution:

eFiling and Data Integration



Problem:

CPSIA eFiling is time-consuming and prone to errors due to manual processes and disconnected systems.

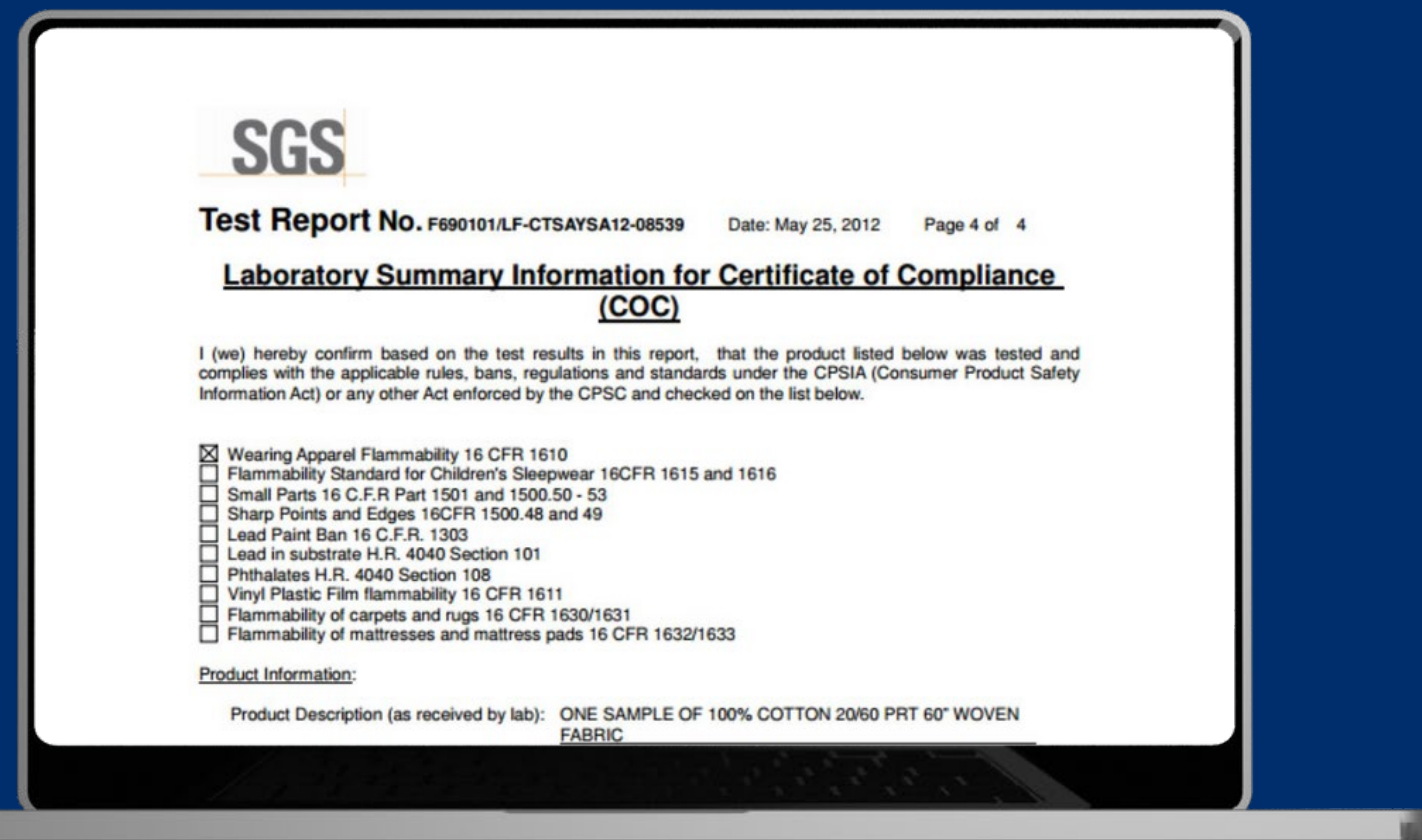
Solution:

Texbase automates eFiling workflows, consolidating lab results and compliance data into a single, streamlined hub.

Solutions for eFiling



Centralized Data Management

- Links lab reports/docs and auto-generates CoCs.

Producing accurate and timely reports for audits and compliance reviews is challenging without centralized, accessible data.

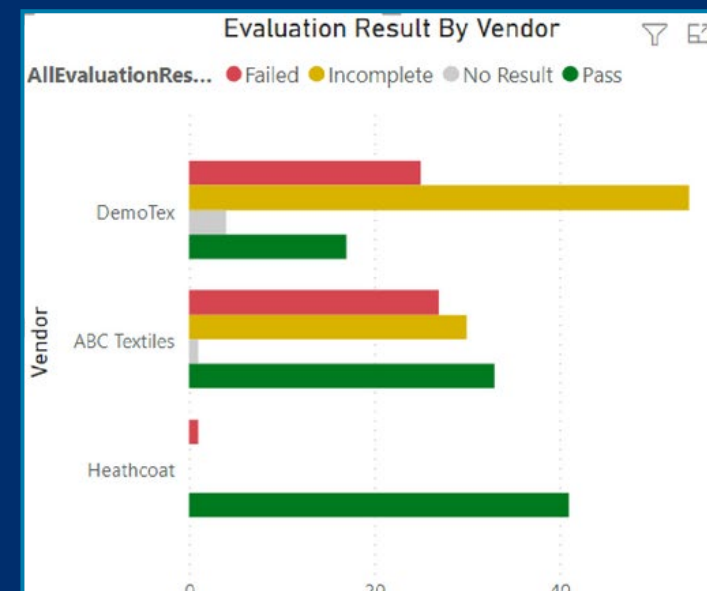

Texbase **Advanced Find & Reporting tools** provide real-time dashboards and customizable reports, enabling quick responses to audits and proactive compliance management.

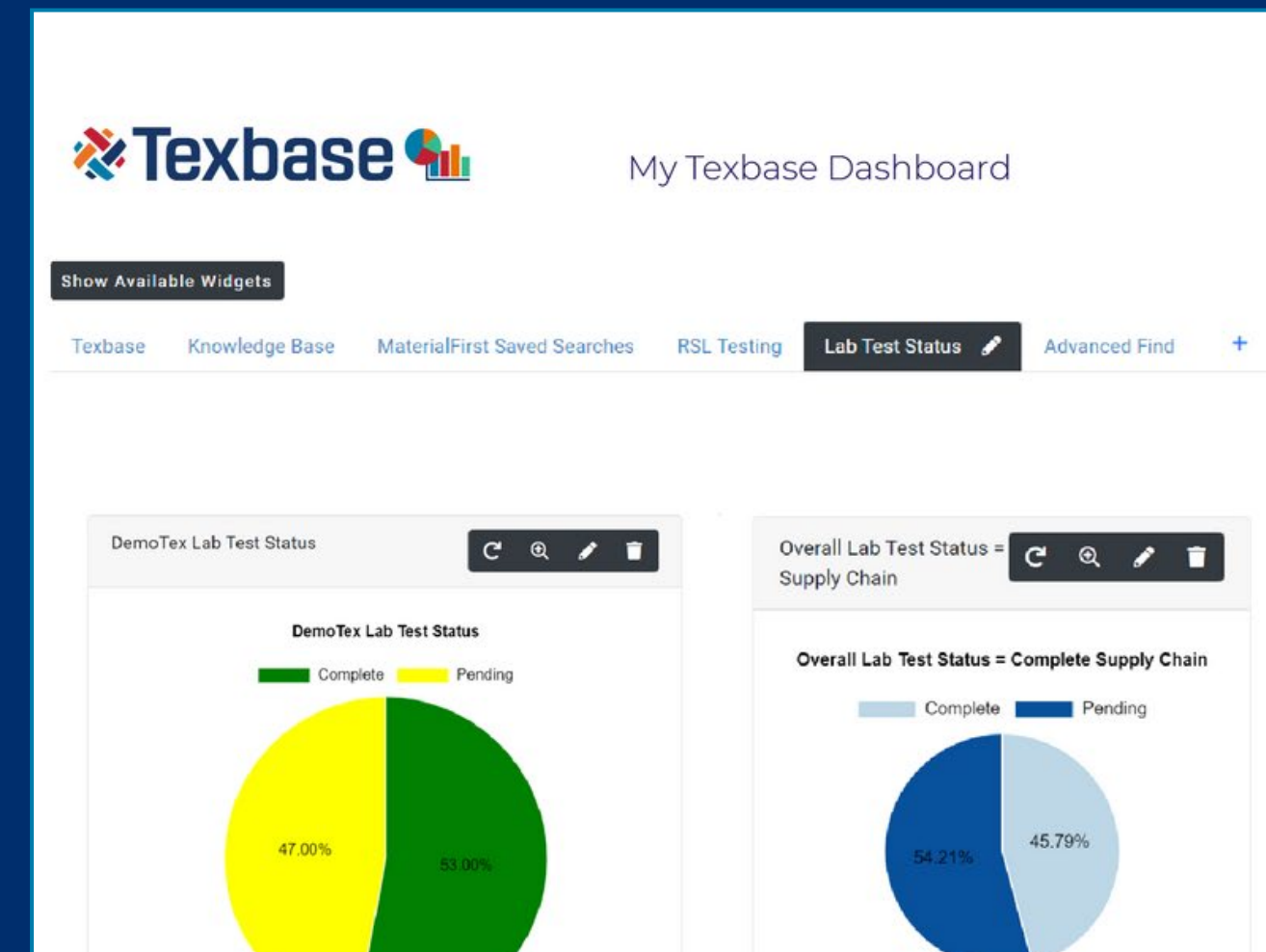
Advanced Find: Search all your data, find what you need.

Dashboards: allows you to monitor internal activities as well as your supply chain partners.

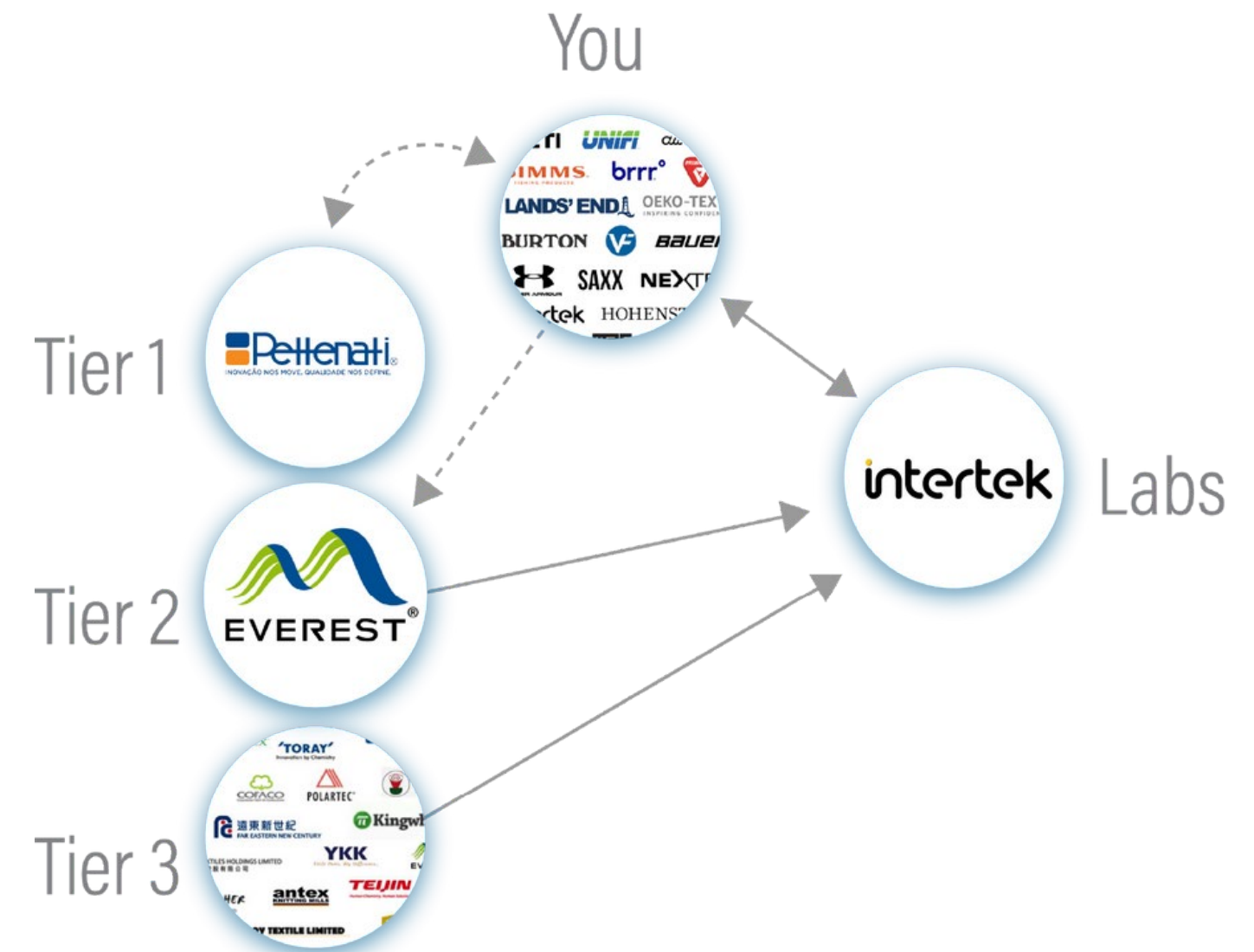

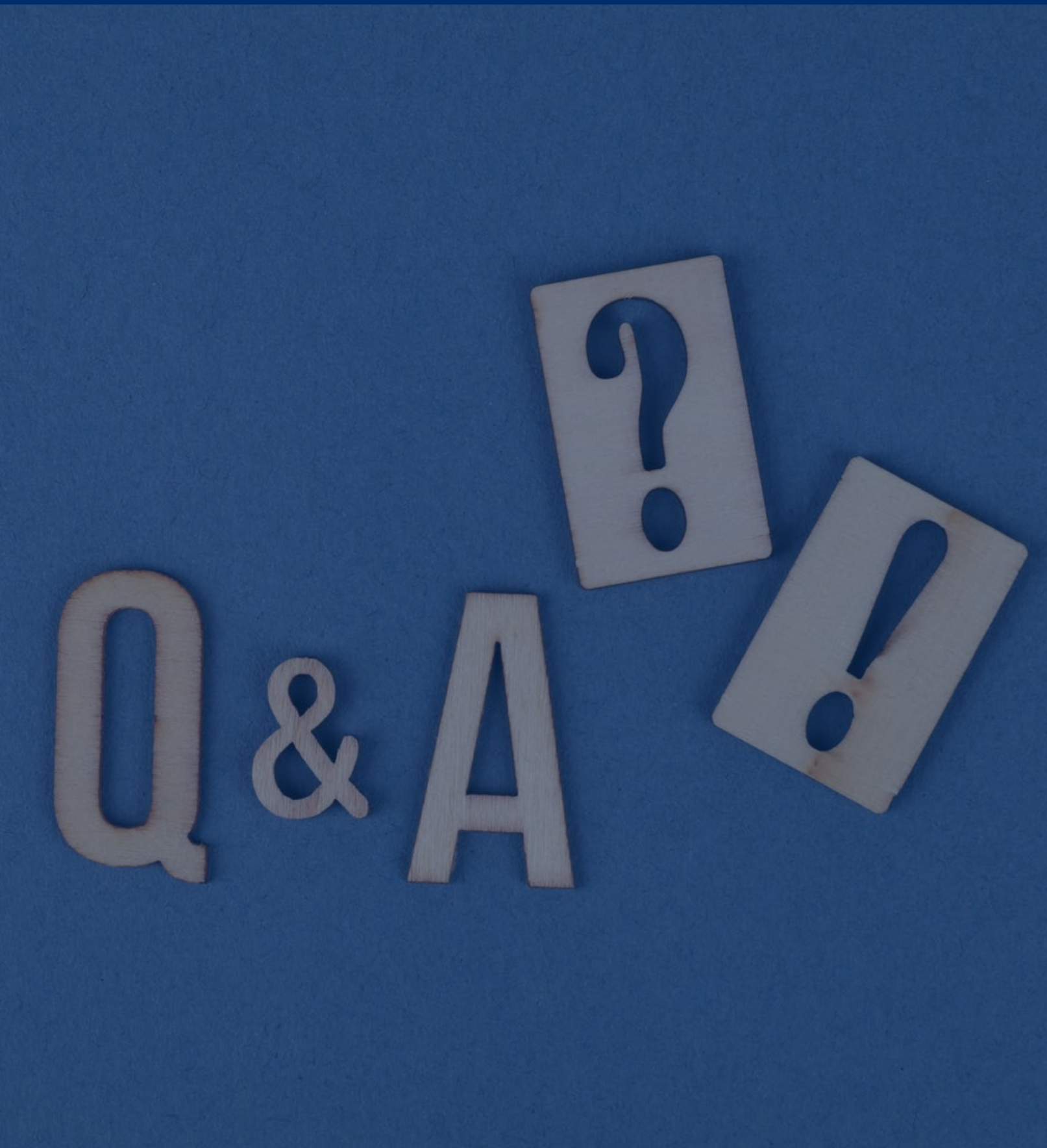
